- 1.) **Read** the selected readings in the *The 33 Days to Morning Glory* book.
- 2.) **Ponder** the daily readings.
- 3.) **Model** Mary’s example – her willingness to say “yes” to God’s will and trust in God’s purpose and plan for her.

The daily reading takes only 3-5 minutes and is then pondered during the rest of one's day. Do not worry if you begin the preparation late or fall behind on chapters. Simply catch up when you are able to do so.

One of the goals of Consecration is a renewed spirit of evangelization that opens our hearts to a closer personal relationship with Jesus through Mary's help. People in every age have found that Marian Consecration brings them closer to God in a profound way.
