Some General Ideas for Ministering with Individuals and Families

- Refer people to the Diocesan Website for ideas about "faith at home" during the Coronavirus
- Using your parish social media, or your email lists, send prayers and words of encouragement to help people with their fear and anxious feelings during this time of social isolation. See sites such as Gratefulness or Spirituality and Practice which has a special section called Spiritual Practices for the Corona Virus Pandemic.
- Encourage individuals and families to continue to have structured sabbath time on Sundays. Pray along with a televised or livestreamed Mass and share about it afterwards. Click here for both televised and streaming options.
- Since we are all practicing frequent handwashing, pray one Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be as you wash your hands. It equals 20 seconds plus at a normal pace. For children just learning their prayers, pray with them or tape them by the sink. Offer these prayers for all suffering from COVID-19 and those who are caring for them.
- You may also consider doing special virtual messages (videos) to your catechists and families for the upcoming Sundays of Lent, Palm Sunday, as well as for the Sacred Triduum and Easter (if we are still under restrictions at that time.) Post these at the same time each week so that individuals and families can build this into their routine.
- Encourage your catechists to take this time to work on their online courses for their own enrichment and certification through Echoes of Faith: Emmaus Edition. Doing so could add a bit of normalcy amid all the uncertainty. There are still free licenses available. Simply contact David Amico or Joyce Solimini.
- Consider having a virtual gathering with your catechists by Facebook Live, Google Hangouts, Zoom, etc. Take time simply to listen to one another and to pray together as a small community of faith.
